

THE LOCHNAGAR INDICATOR.

THE work of the Cairngorm Club in placing an indicator on the summit of Lochnagar, which was fully described in the last issue of the *Cairngorm Club Journal*, has evoked many expressions of interest and appreciation from sister-mountaineering clubs and from the general public.
