Felling, Planting, Stacking and Carving

In October 2015, after several arboricultural experts had raised concerns about rot, fungi, etc. in the three large trees immediately behind the bike shed at Muir Cottage, their felling began. The weather was damp and midgey, but the gang (4 in all) of professionals got on with it, closely watched by Kees Witte and Adrian Scott who was hoping to pick up some tips to take back for his wood near Stonehaven.

Once the felling was complete, and a large proportion of the wood chopped up for firewood, there were several large pieces left. Two were made into a seat and a bench by Tomas Kyncl, the felling contractor, and others were removed from site by Adrian who had an idea that he wanted to work on.

During November, some of the firewood was moved into the woodsheds, and the rest used to start a number of firewood 'hives', following Kees's instructions. By mid-December five hives had been built; their contents will be moved into the woodsheds as space permits.

During the January Burns Weekend, a new mini-plantation was established at the side of Muir, between (but not too near!) the BBQ platform and the pit, using Ben Reid seedlings (Scots pine, hazel and birch). In February, Jean Robinson and Ken Thomson got the remainder of the seedlings into the ground, and some fencing established. This area now complements the one established by the roadside dyke, and should provide some shelter when (as is inevitable) the other "old" trees have to go.

[NB. When the Club purchased Muir in 1969, the price included a separate item of £74 for the eight trees recorded within the boundary: that is (or was) worth about £1160 today!]

Meanwhile, Adrian was busy in his Stonehaven workshop, and in April he and chainsaw specialist Dave Roberts, of Dervish Carving, created a magnificent garden seat (bench? shaded settle?) from sections of the pine trees taken away after the felling (see picture). Hours of design, planning and skill has resulted in something really unique and über-special for Muir: very well done, lads, and thanks!

Quoich Footbridge Funding

In February, the Committee decided to respond to the NTS Mar Lodge Estate flood appeal by offering £25,000 for the repair or replacement of the wooden footbridge over the Quoich at the famous Punchbowl. This bridge was inspected soon after the floods, and found to have badly rotting timbers. The shoochy handrails had probably never been securely attached, and in some cases were being held on by a single nail! Moreover, the whole bridge was found to be out of alignment by some 80mm, possibly due to a timber strike during the 2014 floods.

All this necessitated immediate closure of the footbridge, and with the nearby road bridge now spanning dry land, and the footbridge a mile or so upstream having disappeared, there is no “official” crossing of the Quoich on the popular circular route from Braemar via Invercauld and the Linn o’Dee. David Frew, the Mar Lodge Estate Property Manager, is keen to go ahead, but there appears to be a decision-making blockage at NTS HQ in Edinburgh. The Club has been in touch with both places to urge action. More news over the summer, we hope!

New Deeside Deer Management Group

A public meeting was held at Aboyne in March to inaugurate the South Deeside & North Angus Deer Management Group, a newly formed sub group of the larger East Grampian Deer Management Group (EGDMG) which was established in 1979. It covers about 70,000 hectares, in 11 major ownerships/ ‘deer management units’, i.e. (in order of area) Balmoral and (leased) Abergeldie, Invermark, Glen Callater (within Invercauld), Glen Tanar, Glenmuick, Rottal, North Clova and Forestry Commission Scotland (mainly Glen Doll). The DMG has 14 ‘Public Interest Objectives’, which include habitat condition, woodland expansion, public health and safety, carbon (but not yet water!) storage, and the local economy. It pursues zero tolerance to sika deer (which interbreed with red), reduced impacts on forestry, agriculture and designated habitats, and tackling deer vehicle collisions.

Hillwalking for the Disabled

Mr David Jones has contacted the Club about providing hill-walking opportunities in Scotland for disabled people and their carers. He is a Munroist with an ML award and a background in disability support, and has experience of leading disabled people (specifically sight-impaired and mobility-impaired walkers) in many hills, including a number of Munros in NE Scotland. David would like to assess the likely level of local demand for this sort of service, and is looking for volunteers (preferably with Lower Hill or Mountain Leader awards) or helpers. He has support from the Stroke Association and from DeafBlind Scotland, both of whom have offered to help set this up as a charity. Moreover, he has had early discussions with the MCofS about their aim to ensure the hills are accessible to all. Old Cars and the Dee

As visitors to Muir will have noted, a number (31, apparently) of old cars, along with tons of concrete boulders, railway sleepers and other items, were removed from the north bank of the Dee just below the confluence of the Quoich. This material was used in 1984 to fill a gap in an old dyke which was built to protect deer calving grounds but was breached in 1937. Erosion was creating a risk of damaging the river through release of waste down-river. The new and lower bank, built of natural materials, will allow occasional flooding of the area behind it, and thus benefit natural floodplain habitats.
