

Summer Meet in the Tatra's - Poland and Slovakia

Some adventurous sorts are keen to get hands and feet on some foreign rock. With this in mind, a two-week walking/mountaineering trip to both Poland and Slovakia is proposed.

We will fly Ryanair from Prestwick to Krakow on Thu 2nd Aug returning Thu 16th Aug. Our ultimate destination is the High Tatras of Poland, the highest and most northerly part of the grand Carpathian Mountains. The highest peak is Gerlachovský štít at 2654m and there are nearly 100 summits over 2000m, though only a handful have "tourist routes" all the way to the top. Way-marked and colour-coded paths exist, serviced by chata (huts), the outcome being long or short days of your own design or, if it's rest and relaxation your looking for, Slovakia is definitely the ticket. Time would be split roughly one third in Poland - the walking base being Zakopane - and 8 days on the sunnier Slovakian side at Horný Smokovec. Two nights could also be spent in Kraków - either at the beginning of the trip, or at the end, or one either side - giving time to explore this ancient and beautiful city.

Food, travel and accommodation in both countries are VERY reasonable by UK standards and ALL IN (flights, transfers, B&B accommodation - two sharing) is working out at around £450.00 (based on at least ten of us going).

MCofS

Mountaineering Council of Scotland

After much deliberation by a sub-committee and otherwise over the last nine months or so, the Club Committee decided at its meeting on 24 January to vote in favour of the two motions to be put to a MCofS Special General Meeting in Perth on 17 February. These motions, if passed, will finally permit the conversion of the Council into a company limited by guarantee. It was felt that the current company drafts, while by no means perfect, had been modified to meet most of the Club's major objections to the June 2006 versions, in maintaining the Club's block vote, allowing Club members to "opt out" of MCofS membership, permitting some Club flexibility, e.g. over a child protection policy, and improving procedures over notices of general meetings and MCofS policy adoption. Importantly, third-party liability insurance, arranged through the MCofS and BMC, should continue. The Club will keep a watchful eye on the activities of the new body, whose first AGM is expected in June.

Beauly-Denny Power Line

The National Trust for Scotland, the John Muir Trust, the Mountaineering Council of Scotland and others have set up a consortium to fund legal advice to oppose this line, which, as well as scarring the landscape north and south of Dalwhinnie, will encourage wind and hydro developments in many wild places in the Highlands. The Club has made a substantial donation to the consortium.

February 2007 **Club Library**

We have approximately 1000 books held in the Special Collections library in Aberdeen University. This is open to Club members on production of a membership card. An alphabetical listing of books is given on the Club website www.cairngormclub.org.uk/library.



UDAT

The Upper Deeside Access Trust has now completed its substantial programme of works under the Eastern Cairngorms Access Project, and is now undertaking or planning smaller tasks, e.g. a Quoich-Slugain link-up, a circular route in Glen Callater, and a 200-metre further stretch on Lochnagar. The major outstanding problem in the area is the path up Mount Keen from Glentanar, but this will have to await consultation with the estate, and substantial further funding. A review of access priorities will be undertaken (some 5 years after the original exercise), and the Club hopes to be involved in this.

Cairngorms National Park Extension Bill

John Swinney MSP is proposing a Bill which would restore to the Cairngorms National Park that part of Perthshire (including Spital of Glen Shee, Ben a'Ghlo, Blair Atholl, Ben Vorlich, and Beinn Udlamain) which the Scottish Executive removed from the SNHrecommended area for the Park when it was designated. The Club has written a letter of support to the Scottish Parliament Committee which is considering the Bill.

CNPA CPP

The Cairngorms National Park Plan, on which the Club commented in some detail last year, has now been submitted to Scottish Ministers for approval.

Aberdeenshire Outdoor Access Forum (ALOAF)

The Forum advises on non-motorised access (rights of way, core paths, etc.) outside the Cairngorms National Park area, and is holding its second Annual Gathering at the Thainstone Centre near Inverurie at 6.30 for 7.00 on Monday 5 March. There will be a few short presentations and an Any Questions? session, and opportunities to quiz Council and other agency officials face-to-face. All will be welcome, but for catering purposes those interested are invited to contact Ken Thomson (the Forum Chair) or the Outdoor Access Officer at Gordon House, Inverurie (ga.planapps@aberdeenshire.gov.uk).
